Gregg Johnson, Chairperson, called the meeting to order, and announced posting of "Open Meeting" laws act on the bulletin board located on the West wall of the Fire Hall common area.

The minutes of the Mar 15th, 2022 Regular Meeting were reviewed. A motion to accept the minutes as read was made by Bill Drake, and seconded by Lorissa Anderson. Voting Aye: Bill Drake, Lorissa Anderson and Hunter Goldsby. Voting Nay: None – MOTION CARRIED

Clerk/Treasurer read the Apr 5th, 2022 Treasurer's Report. Lorissa Anderson made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as read. Bill Drake seconded the motion. Voting Aye: Bill Drake, Lorissa Anderson and Hunter Goldsby. Voting Nay: None – MOTION CARRIED

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- Clerk presented mowing bid to Board from Tyler Bradley. It was quoted on a flat per month fee. The Board wants to see a per occurrence bid. Clerk to contact Tyler to see if he would be interested in redoing his bid.
- The board discussed plans for the landfill. Board Member, Lorissa Anderson, is working on new signs, breaking the site up into designated areas for grass clippings, branches and tree limbs that are small enough to break down on their own, and an area for trees and wood. The same rules will apply, i.e., no nails, metal or railroad ties, etc.
  - Compost boxes: The board discussed an area for composting and applying for a safety grant with LARM to pay for the boxes. Board Member, Hunter Goldsby, will look into pricing the compost boxes.
  - Wood Chipper: Hunter Goldsby will check with Myers Construction to see if they maintain their own wood chipper or if they have someone else do the actual chipping.
  - Key Control: The Board is discussing different ways of controlling the keys to the landfill and keeping track of who comes and goes if there is a need for follow-up in regard to illegal dumping, etc
- Clerk presented bid from CHARRON Lawn for weed maintenance. Spraying the parks and tennis courts will be \$1,275.00 per occurrence. The spraying for sandburs will be \$250.00 per occurrence. Clerk to contact Kyle Charron to inquire about the ball field. Bill Drake made a motion to accept the bid for weed control, Lorissa Anderson seconded the motion. Voting Aye: Bill Drake, Lorissa Anderson and Hunter Goldsby. Voting Nay: None MOTION CARRIED
- The Board questioned whether or not we were going to continue maintaining Sorenson park too, Hunter Goldsby will contact the owners in this regard.
- The Board discussed paving out from the North corner of the fire hall to the flag pole up to the sidewalk to place the memorial bench, as well as an awning to shade the area. Hunter Goldsby is having some concrete work done and will talk to the person who is doing that work to see what it would cost to do the concrete work for the Fire Hall. The Board discussed using the ARP funds to cover the cost of the awning and concrete work since the fire hall is for the use of all residents of the Village, as well as a designated shelter.
